

What started out as a smaller endeavor began to grow in members as well as frequency. In the true spirit of working together, a staff person and an AABR member came together as Co-Captains for each team.

Together the people we support learn about sportsmanship, positive support and leadership as they work with established staff and management. What began as several residences getting together for fun and camaraderie developed into a full-fledged AABR Bowling League! Now people from 10 residential homes compete at The Whitestone Bowling Lanes for a chance to win the championship. The League has grown in number to 40 people. Each Individual experiences the outing differently, some to win, some for the workout, others for friendship and fun on three Wednesday nights each month. Any way we look at it, everyone is taking part in the winner's lane!





In a collected effort, AABR has petitioned The Office of People with Developmental Disabilities (OPWDD) to transition from operating Intermediate Care Facilities (ICF's) to help foster greater levels of independence and community connection in Individualized Residential Alternatives (IRA's) for the people we support. Person centered planning is at the heart of this transition as we look to further to incorporate each person's individual choices, interests and needs in a positive, productive atmosphere. Planning from a person centered approach means that we look to listen and get to know each Individual. Steps are taken to provide exposure to the arts, music, community memberships and events so that those we support are able to make educated choices from a myriad of options based on their skills, preferences an interests. AABR is looking forward to this next phase of working even more closely with people in our mission, "that each life may have meaning."


